ABOUT THE FOOD BANK OF YORK REGION

The Food Bank of York Region (FBYR) is a registered Canadian charity committed to providing hungerrelief to people experiencing severe food insecurity. We serve as a regional food collection and distribution centre to a network of 60+ non-profit agencies, including municipal food banks and pantries, shelters, and non-profit housing cooperatives, as well as providing mobile food bank services.

Why We Do It

In spite of the perceived affluence and wealth of York Region, according to the 2016 census, 157,690 York Region residents lived in low-income households –14% of all households in York Region. Approximately 24,700 York Region households experienced various levels of food insecurity. Of these, 28.5% were children (2016 Census York, Regional Municipality). Why Food Insecurity in our Region

Food insecurity affects a vulnerable segment of York Region's population. Growing levels of food insecurity have been traced to:

- Precarious employment or self-employment without benefits, as well as unemployment and underemployment;
- Seniors and persons with disabilities, dependent on Old Age Security or disability support, struggling with rising costs of living;
- Cost of housing and effects of skyrocketing rental markets and rising cost of food;
- The impact of COVID-19, which has exacerbated existing trends of food insecurity.

First and foremost, we would like to thank every individual, organization, and business that joined forces with us in 2021 to address food insecurity in York Region. Our work would not be possible without the food retailers that donate surplus food, the organizations that provide funding to keep our trucks running and our warehouses in operation, and volunteers who give of their time. The past year has been a challenging one, as the increased food insecurity prompted by the Covid pandemic continued in 2021. Our Food Bank responded by meeting the need through our expanded food collection and distribution programs. We also expanded our Covid-19 Home Delivery program to reach a heightened number of people requesting food aid. In 2021, we conducted research and published the first York Region Report on Hunger to raise awareness of food insecurity and poverty in our region.

We are proud of our team at the Food Bank of York Region for their tireless efforts to provide food assistance to members of our community facing food insecurity. Thanks to their efforts and that of our network of community partners, generous donors, and committed volunteers, together we continue to advance in our mission of ending hunger in York Region.

Our Impact in 2021

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, food retailers, local businesses, and partner organizations, in 2021 the Food Bank of York Region distributed food for 2,786,380 meals to our non-profit network and our home delivery program for our region's most vulnerable residents.

Our COVID-19 Response

The Food Bank of York Region launched our Covid-19 Home Delivery program in May 2020, to assist people in need of food who were unable to access food programs, including seniors, persons with disabilities, and single-parent households. Since initiating the program, we have delivered over \$3.4 million worth of emergency hampers to 5,221 food-insecure households.

Covid-19 Home Delivery Program Impact

The struggles of these past two years have brought us together as a community, and we have seen an outpouring of generosity to meet the need! Thanks to funding received from United Way, Food Banks Canada and the Regional Municipality of York, FBYR was able to provide emergency COVID-19 response in our region, bringing food to people's doors who would otherwise not be able to access food assistance programs.



"I'm really grateful for the program because it's saved not only my household but also that of relatives and friends. A lot of us were already going through hard times before the pandemic and things became more hopeless during the pandemic. Having a home delivery program with fresh food and more frequency has literally saved our lives. I always call our delivery driver 'our hero' because that's what you are to us."

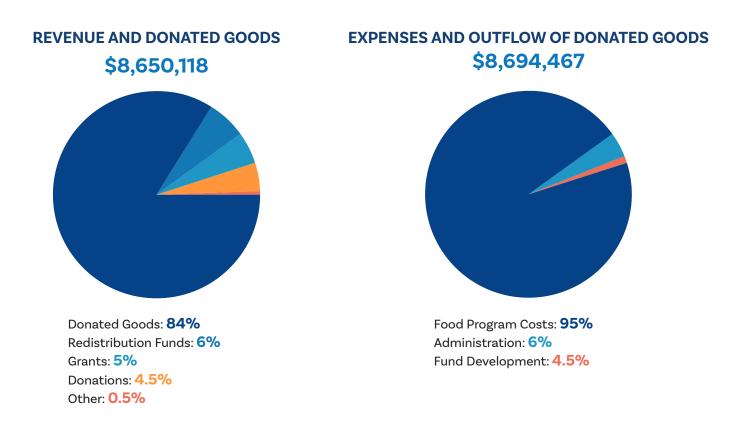
"For someone like me who is relatively comfortable, I am seeing a hike in food prices. I can't imagine what it is like for someone in a less fortunate or stressful
